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The Italian Navy frigate Carabiniere is at Valletta Cruise Port's Quays Pinto 4-5 until 5th June.

This visit is part of the ongoing Operation Mediterraneo Sicuro, an Italian Navy-led mission, to ensure maritime security in the Mediterranean Sea.

Whilst in Malta, the ship's crew will take part in a series of activities aimed at strengthening bilateral cooperation with the Armed Forces of Malta in order to

enhance collaboration in naval operations and maritime security.

Visitors have the opportunity to visit the Carabinieri during an open day tomorrow Monday June 2nd, Italian National Day, with public access from 10am till noon and from 3pm till 5pm.

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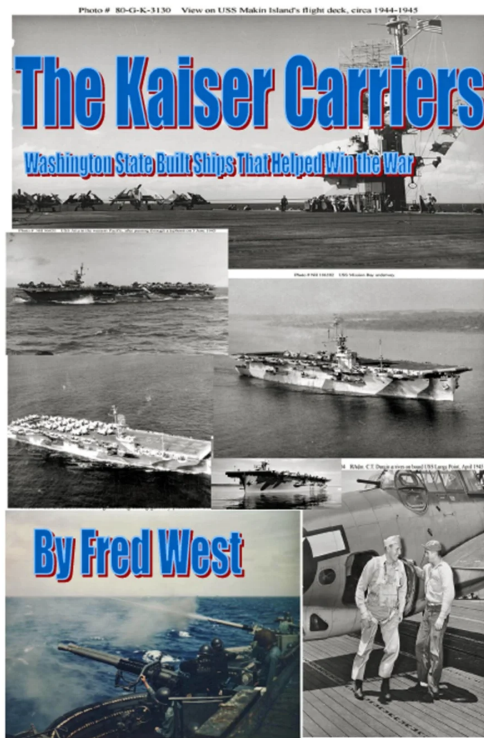
